Synopsis

The day Alex tries to put a virus in the computer system of a bank, a car accident makes him lose his short-term memory.

When he wakes up in hospital, he discovers that he has been lying in coma for two days. What has happened?

Alex follows a therapy in order to recover his memory of the day of the accident. For him, visions and reality are thrown together in a confusing maze.

Alex tries to escape from this muddle but what he discovers turns out to be rather frightening...

Director's statement

The adversaries of the capitalist system and its defenders very often use the same methods to reach their goals. An act may be considered both as a terrorist act or as a necessary defence. Therefore, the question of who is the terrorist is only a matter of point of view.

Implanting a computer virus which disrupts financial transactions is generally considered a terrorist act. ABSOLUT is the story of Alex, the hacker who plants the virus. By identifying with him, the audience places itself on the "terrorist's" side without ever thinking of defining him as such.

In order to make the audience active, the plot of this political thriller is non-linear. Like a puzzle, it obliges the spectator to put pieces of information together. This also makes the film engaging and entertaining.

However, the story told in ABSOLUT is serious because one based on a terrible testimony. In order to protect the witness and for legal reasons, the plot has been adapted so that individuals and institutions involved cannot be identified.

In spite of all the research done, no definitive evidence has been found. But eventually, truthfulness looses importance when considering that such a story is absolutely possible and that it would certainly have been hushed up.

The film ABSOLUT also proposes a very complete Website with explanations on the origins of the project, some of the research done to verify evidence and links to other contextual sites. The site connects the film to everyday reality and invites the audience to take parts.

VINCENT BONILLO (ALEX)

Originally from France, Vincent Bonillo currently lives in Lausanne and works both in Switzerland and France. On stage, he has performed under various directors, including Claude Stratz, Jeanlouis Martinelli, Philippe Morand, Anne Bisang, Brigitte Jaques and Oscar Gomez Mata. As a film actor, he has worked in about ten films, i.e. "Le Lapin à la Cubaine" directed by Daniel Maurer, "Nuit d'Éveil", directed by Pascal Magnin, "Accord Perdu", directed by Amina Djahnine and "Genève-Marseille" directed by Frédéric Choffat. He is also the co-founder of several the rock/hard-core/rap groups in Marseilles, Paris and Lausanne and has written music for performances as well as a number of "electro" soundtracks.

IRENE GODEL (DR. TARKOVA)

Originally from Austria, Irene Godel lives in Rolle (Vaud). She works in French-speaking as much as in German-speaking Switzerland. On stage she was Christine Brochant in "Le Dîner de Cons", by Francis Veber, which has been performed both in French-speaking Switzerland and France. On television, she acted in " Paul et Virginie" and "Entrez sans Sonner" among other programs. Her voice can often be recognized in documentary films and TV shows.

FRANÇOIS NADIN (FRED)

François Nadin lives in Geneva and in Paris. On stage, he most recently appeared in "L'illusion Comique de Corneille", directed by Brigitte Jaques and performed in Geneva, Paris and in other French towns. In 2000, he participated to a major French tour of Moliere's "Dom Juan", including performances at the Théâtre de l'Odéon. He has just finished working on the Canadian film, "Les Etats-Unis d'Albert", directed by André Forcier. He has also appeared in Vincent Pluss' film, "On Dirait le Sud", which won a Swiss Film Award in 2003.



DELPHINE LANZA (LUCIE)

Born in France, Delphine Lanza lives in Geneva. On stage, she has just finished performing in Dorian Rossel's "Jours Heureux", which toured in French-speaking Switzerland and France. She has also acted in "Othello", directed by Valentin Rossier and in "Don Giovanni", by Matthias Langhoff. She recently appeared in "Demain j'arrête", directed by Nicole Borgeat, which received an award at the Locarno International Film Festival. In 2000, Delphine Lanza won the Swiss Films Award for Best Actress as Lorette in "Attention aux Chiens" by François-Christophe Marzal.

VÉRONIQUE MERMOUD (DR. KÖNIG)

Véronique Mermoud lives in Fribourg. In 1978, she founded the Théâtre des Osses with Gisèle Sallin. In addition to working in her own theatre as actress and artistic director, she frequently acts in other theatres, such as at the Comédie de Genève, where she met Benno Besson and played the role of Tartagliona in "L'Oiseau Vert" by Gozzi. The play then toured in Switzerland, France, Belgium, Italy and Canada. She has received the Performer's Award for her lifetime work and was awarded the Hans Reinhart Ring, the most prestigious recognition in Swiss theatre. On television, she has been seen in several episodes of "Sauvetage" and in many films, including "Les Épaules Solides", directed by Ursula Meier.
